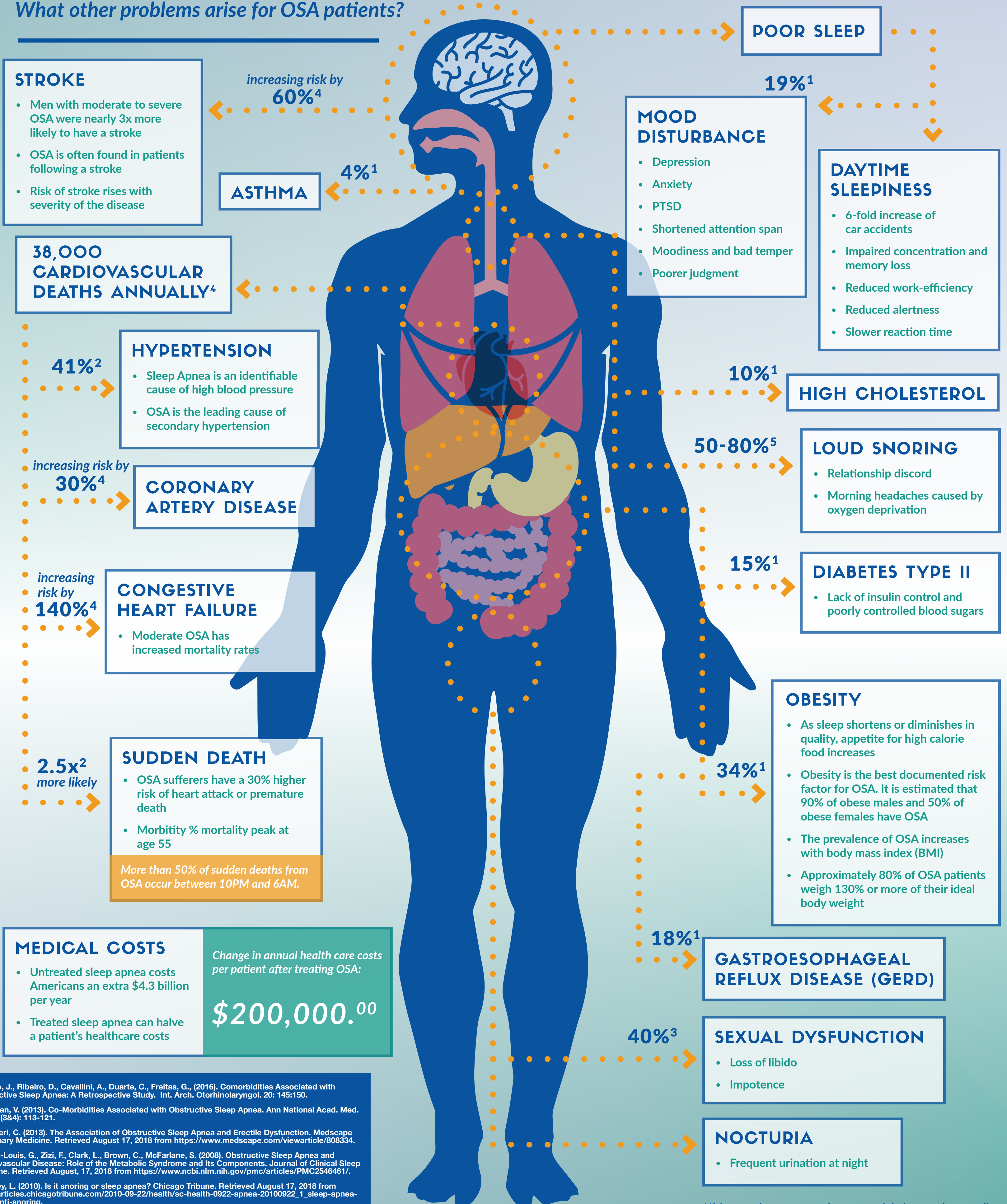


The Consequences of OBSTRUCTIVE SLEEP APNEA
